Lent is approaching

Next Sunday there will be a pastoral letter from His Grace, Archbishop Peter in preparation for Lent. It is timely then to say a few words about that Holy Season if we are to make the most of it in our run up to Easter.

Originally, Lent was the time when converts to Christianity would make their final preparations for their reception into the Church Easter on Saturday evening. In time, the whole Christian community would join them in this preparation time, and so we have the Lent that we are more familiar with.

The Church offers us a unique time of growth and repentance, so that we will be spiritually ready for the great celebration of the Lord's resurrection at



Easter. It offers us three tools to help us form our spiritual lives during Lent. They are Prayer, Fasting and Good Works.

In this period before Lent we have the opportunity to decide how best we can make use of the period of Lent to deepen our relationship with God. We might decide to go to one of the daily masses during the weeks of Lent or give some time to adoration before the

Blessed Sacrament or say an additional decade of the Rosary, or give an additional five minutes or so to our morning or evening prayer. With fasting it is always healthy to cut down something that we have grown to depend on during the year. It might be that glass of wine or pint of beer at the end of the day. For those with a sweet tooth it might be sweets or cakes. For the really repentant it might even be the cigarettes! And Good Works, it might be giving a hand to an elderly neighbour, or giving something extra to your favourite charity, it might even be restraining the urge to gossip, as the Holy Father is always suggesting! Pick something from each of the tools and you will be ready for Lent.

### SECOND COLLECTION

Next Sunday's second collection will be for Poor Parishes: formerly Needs of the Diocese collection, this collection enables the Archbishop to make grants to some of the poorer parishes in the diocese.

#### **CAR PARKING**

The parking facilities on parish premises should only be used by 'authorised users'. 'Authorised users' are people visiting the church or parish premises. As a concession, parents delivering and collecting children from school are also permitted to use the car park. But parents visiting the schools for longer periods (e.g. for assemblies or meetings) are not permitted to use the parish parking facilities. Teachers at the schools are not permitted to use the car park.

Illegal use of the carpark results in authorised users being unable to park.

The parish caretaker, as part of his duties, is attempting to enforce the parking policy and he will continue to do so. It is our intention to rigorously enforce this policy and we will resort to clamping if necessary.
