The Scrutinies

On this third Sunday of Lent, we have the first of the scrutinies celebrated with those who are to be received into the Church on Easter night. This last stage of their journey into the Church is shared this Lent with the people of the parish during the Sunday Mass. This is one of three scrutinies over the coming Sundays culminating with ceremonies of Holy week and their first reception sacraments. of The readings of the mass this Sunday at which the scrutinies are celebrated reflect the significance of the events linked to the Gospel story. the of the story at the woman well. There is so much in this story, both of forgiveness and reconciliation. The fact that the woman is alone at the well is significant. It suggests that she is not well accepted in the village. If she were she would have met the others around the well to collect the morning water for the family. She is, we find out from the story, a woman with a history. It is Jesus'

acceptance of her and his willingness to accept her and her gift of water from the well. He in turn will give her living water, which is himself. His word of truth will refresh and bring her reconciliation not only with God with but herself and with other members of her community. As we look again at the story of the woman at the well we can see ourselves in that same position conscious of the love that God has for us, bringing to us forgiveness and reconciliation especially during this special time of Lent. Finally we pray for our candidates preparing to join us this Easter.
