TODAY'S MASS

First Reading (Acts 4:8-12): St Peter, arraigned before the High Court, is not afraid to take the opportunity to proclaim the Good News of the Resurrection of Christ to the highest authorities in the land.

Psalm: Psalm 117 again, but today's extract is a statement of faith and a manifesto for living in the Lord.

Second Reading (Ps 117:1.8-9.21-23.26.28-29): Through Baptism we share in the life of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, and therefore are properly called 'children of God'.

Gospel (Jn 10:11-18): Jesus Christ describes Himself as the good shepherd. In His day Palestinian shepherds lived with the sheep, knew them by name, defended them from wolves and robbers. This image is found in the Old Testament, but Jesus takes the image further, by saying that "*I lay down my life for my sheep*".

61st WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS TO THE PRIESTHOOD AND RELIGIOUS LIFE

This Sunday is traditionally known as *Good Shepherd Sunday*. The theme this year is *Called to sow seeds of hope and to build peace*. The message of His Holiness Pope Francis for this day can be found on the Vatican website (www.vatican.va). He ends his message with these words to younger people to commit to their vocation: "*In this light, I would say once more, as I did at World Youth Day in Lisbon: "Rise up!" Let us awaken from sleep, let us leave indifference behind, let us open the doors of the prison in which we so often enclose ourselves, so that each of us can discover his or her proper vocation in the Church and in the world, and become a pilgrim of hope and a builder of peace! Let us be passionate about life and commit ourselves to caring lovingly for those around us, in every place where we live. Let me say it again: "Have the courage to commit!"*"

CAR PARKING

ARCHDIOCESAN VIRAL PRAYER CAMPAIGN
