Faith and Heaven's Higher Standard

Faith that can move mountains is a gift. We can ask for it in prayer. There are also mountains that shake faith. These can be temptations and the many challenging situations that life throws at us. Stronger than the mountains that shake faith, is the faith that moves mountains. That is what the Lord wants for his disciples, for Christians. We must always remember that we have God and all his power with us.

Hard as this may be, the truth is that the mountains that shake faith nurture our faith. You may be among those who ask, 'how long, Lord, am I to cry for help while you will not lis-



ten...?' (Hab. 1:2). You may be among those who strive so strenuously in life with neither recognition nor adequate remuneration. You have to give your all, to qualify as a mere servant. (cf. Lk 17:7-10). In all, St. Paul says, 'fan into a flame the gift that God gave you... bear the hardships for the sake of the Good news, relying on the power of God... you have been trusted to look something precious, guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us.' (2Tm1:6, 8, 14). Here is Heaven's higher standard that: 'to remain 'faith-full' till the end is a praiseworthy success. God rewards effort and this is consoling. Mother Angelica summarises Heaven's higher standard: 'Where most people work for degrees after their names, we work for one before our names: ST. It's a much more difficult degree to attain. It takes a lifetime, and you don't get your diploma until you're dead'.

PRAYER FOR THE YEAR OF MERCY

Lord Jesus, send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind. Amen
