

Moving to Easter

How has your Lent gone so far? Have you managed to keep to all your resolutions or have things gradually been let slide as the weeks have gone on? The danger for all of us is that if we have allowed our resolutions to slide, we may have lost heart or motivation to do anything about it. Well we should take heart. Today we start what was known as Passiontide, the final two weeks leading to the feast of the Resurrection of Jesus. To mark this time and to encourage us to focus on the suffering and death of Jesus the statues in the church are veiled. As we through progress Passiontide we share with Jesus the events of his last days before his death and resurrection. We will be with him in the days before his



arrest, when in Jerusalem there is a growing fascination in lesus and his works. Today Jesus does himself no favours as he calls the bluff of the scribes and Pharisees. The people though see the justice of his acts and it leads to his great entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday which we celebrate next Sunday. Then with Jesus we will spend the final days with his friends until his arrest on Holy Thursday night, his trial and condemnation and execution on Good Friday. It is his joyous resurrection on Easter Day at the Easter

Vigil, that marks the end our **Passiontide** of celebrations.

If you have failed to keep your Lenten resolutions, renew them now for the last two weeks of Lent. The events of the next two weeks should provide a great incentive for us to keep to our resolutions and to gain the maximum benefit from them as we approach the feast of Easter. Remember we encouraged to deepen relationship with our through prayer, fasting and good works. The Stations of the Cross are a most appropriate devotion for these days of Passiontide, as is making an offering to one of the many charities looking for our support. These days are there to enrich us.
