The 2016 Parish Crib Appeal - Update

We have just started the 40 day Lenten season. This season emphasises amongst other Christian practices, prayer, fasting While and almsgiving. three are interconnected, the last of these three - almsgiving remains the pillar of Christianity. Lister generator' pump the water distribution. All things being equal, the target is to have it ready for Easter this April, when it will be blessed and commissioned by the Bishop of my home Diocese.

I write this update with a deep sense and sincere sentiment of gratitude. Thank you to the very first person that thought out this project, to all those who supported and still support the ongoing project with their money and known and prayers, mostly unknown to me. Yes, I may never know you in person but be assured that the beneficiaries and I pray for you. They will drink the water to your health and total well-being.
